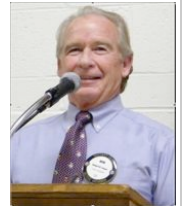

Program: Scholarship Committee Report

Joe updated the Club on the work of our Scholarship Committee. The Club gives \$7500 to the fund, and has a major impact on the lives of the students who win the scholarships.



The Committee has developed criteria to share with school guidance counselors to help them develop a pool of students to apply for the scholarships, and the Scholarship Committee makes the final selections from among the applicants.

Applicants must present a letter of recommendation from (a) a teacher or a leader in the community and (b) a peer. The Committee feels that support both from adults and peers is the mark of the sort student who embodies the qualities Rotary most supports. Applicants must also submit a 300 word essay on Service Above Self. Joe and other committee members noted that there is an incredible number of talented young people in our community, and that choosing among the candidates was really tough this year.
