Barbara Schenck had a special guest, Stacie Oxman of Xenia. Barbara called Stacie the first true "hero" I've known. While attending a recent Bengals game Stacie went to a restroom that ended up being two levels above her seats. Exiting a stall she found a lady on the ground



with no pulse, struggling to breathe and her heart had gone into an irregular rhythm. Stacie an intensive care nurse at Good Samaritan Hospital Dayton started CPR and told the woman's daughter to go call 911 and get help. A policeman arrived and Stacie asked for a defibrillator. She had to shock the woman twice before she began regular breathing and put her heart in rhythm. I really believe someone put me in that bathroom that day. One other time, Stacie had to perform CPR and needed a defibrillator but it was locked up in a school principal's office. Thus, we all should learn CPR and how to use a defibrillator. (Bengal Fan Terry Tobey wished Stacie had gone down on the field and used the defibrillator on a some of the Bengal players.)

Jeff Eyrich program chair of the day introduced Nancy Marconett of the Harlequin Haven Great Dane Rescue (HHGDR) which is a No Kill shelter dedicated to saving and placing abused, abandoned, and neglected Great Danes in suitable, loving, and forever homes in Ohio, Northern Kentucky, and Eastern Indiana.. Nancy a Wilmington resident became involved after retiring in 1999 although the center opened in the early 1990's.

The presently house 40 Great Danes with a five St Bernards,



some other breeds along with some mixed breeds at the center located outside of Bethel, Ohio. The Rescue dedicated to rescuing Great Danes and Saint Bernards placing them in suitable homes. HHGDR is a no-kill rescue, and those animals which are not adopted will live out their natural lives at the Rescue. The Rescue has no paid employees.

Nancy said most rescues come from well meaning families who buy a dog or other pet and cannot spend the time or money to care for the pet. If you spend 10-12 hours away from home each day do not get a Great Dane. Buying a cute little Dane puppy for a very young child is not advised as the Dane will be 50-70 pounds in six months.

The Rescue is very restrictive and checks family references before adopting out a dog as they do not want to get the dog back.. Danes are expensive to feed and maintain. Veterinarian bills are generally based on size of the dog. Cages are special order for the colossal size.

As a nonprofit organization they are always in need of funding to feed and care for the many dogs. Veterinarian can run \$20,000/year. An interesting fund raiser they have developed is selling paw paintings by "Mozart" and other pawtographed items. Mozart places his paw into various paint colors and then

places his paw on canvas in a variety and has become quite popular. They have sold on eBay and art galleries in the area.

Interestingly Nancy mentioned that all the breeds of the American Kennel Association have a Rescue organization as do other pet animals. Most of the dogs at local "dog pounds" are pure breeds. If you wish a pure breed dog go to a local pound.

Her final comment people need to do there homework before purchasing a pet- horse, cat, bird, etc. Then make a commitment for the lifetime of that pet which for dogs may be 10-12 years.

The Object of Rotary is to encourage and foster the ideal of service as a basis of worthy enterprise and, in particular, to encourage and foster:

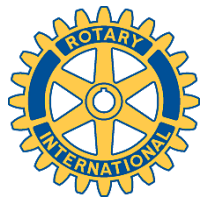
FIRST. The development of acquaintance as an opportunity for service;
