Program: Xenia Mural Society

Gloria Roth introduced Sue Hunt, Alan King, Rob Richards, and Becky Louderback from the Xenia Mural Society. The Society formed in 2007 and applied for an Ohio Arts grant in partnership with Greene Giving.



There are 18 entries in the design contest, and the Xenia Rotary will donate \$500 to the winner. The mural will be painted on the Montgomery Insurance building when fundraising is complete.

The Xenia Mural Society will help with the creation of a number of pieces of public mural art in Xenia. They work to help building owners to locate funding for public art from the private and public sectors and to promote expansion and preservation of other Xenia Murals in the future.

There is a lot of fundraising work to be done: a mural costs between \$5000 and \$20,000, with the majority of the cost going to prepare the building for painting.

In 1932, Rotarian Herbert J. Taylor created The Four-Way Test, a code of ethics adopted by Rotary 11 years later. The test, which has been translated into more than 100 languages, asks the following questions:

Of the things we think, say or do

1. Is it the TRUTH?
2. Is it FAIR to all concerned?
3. Will it build GOODWILL and BETTER FRIENDSHIPS?
4. Will it be BENEFICIAL to all concerned?
