Program: Teacher Michelle Roby and four McKinley Elementary School Super Math Blasters

Michelle Roby is a 4th/5th math teacher at McKinley for the last 10 years but with 30 years



experience. She believes in making Math Fun! She has developed a fun quiz of asking students to solve math problems while waiting in line for lunch or the bathroom. The students helped her develop physical motions on remembering math concepts i.e. for an Isosceles Triangle- they point to the two eyes and then use two fingers as two equal sides of a triangle of equal size.

The Fast Math questions were too fast for the editor to write them down and the students had the answers before he quit writing. For example: $5 \times 5 - 1 / 6 \times 4 - 1 = \text{huh?}$ But the students answered several of this type of question before the club members could say, *What did she say?*

Students must learn different math functions, tables, even some algebra to be a *Math Buster* and a *Super Math Buster*. They also learn *The Why?* of $7 \times 8 = 56$. *Constructive Response Questions (CRQ)* are asked on the Proficiency Test. Students must explain not just know the answer by rote memory. These 5th graders are way ahead of us older folks.
